PRO-CHOICE WASHINGTON

Each election cycle, Pro-Choice Washington works to elect reproductive freedom champions who will protect and promote access to abortion and the full range of reproductive options in Washington state.

We prioritize endorsing candidates in districts where the most gains can be made for abortion access by:

- Increasing capacity to win in the most competitive swing districts where reproductive freedom champions face tough races against anti-abortion opponents.
- Building power in districts
 where constituents face the
 biggest barriers to abortion
 access, like long travel times to
 an abortion provider, a high
 prevalence of fake clinics, and
 an increase in anti-abortion
 and white nationalist activity.
- Creating a representative and inclusive movement for reproductive freedom by investing in candidates of color who have lived experience with healthcare barriers.

This year, with 87 percent of legislative seats up for election, and abortion rights fully in the hands of states, we prioritized endorsements in state legislative races.

We also included endorsements in a few key races in Spokane County because of the important role that local government can play in increasing abortion access and protecting the rights of patients and providers in eastern Washington.

As a state-based organization, we cannot make endorsements in federal races, but we encourage you to learn more about what's at stake in Washington's congressional candidates and get involved to support candidates that support reproductive freedom in your district.

Our endorsement process begins by inviting candidates from districts where we can make the biggest strategic impact, as well as previously-endorsed reproductive freedom champions, to apply for Pro-Choice Washington endorsement.

Candidates respond to a questionnaire that evaluates their position on abortion access, policies that support the full range of reproductive health options, and issues that allow our communities to thrive, such as progressive tax reform, voting rights, and police accountability.

Candidates whose responses align with our values are interviewed by members of our Political Action Committee (PAC) board. Based on these interviews, our PAC board recommends the candidates to endorse.

And, finally, the PAC recommendations are voted on by our 501(c)4 board, Pro-Choice Washington's political advocacy arm.
